
Christmas Star Best of All

This block first appeared in **<u>Practical Needlework</u>** 1906 by Clara as

Best of All and was later named Christmas Star by Hinson in 1973.

А	Background Fabric Cut 8 squares 2 ½ Inches Small triangles 2-3 ¼ inch squares cut diagonally twice Large triangles 2-5 ¼ inch squares cut diagonally twice.
В	Star Points 8 – 2 7/8 inch squares cut once on the diagonal. (16 triangles)
С	Complimentary Fabric 4 – 2 inch squares (inner star) 1 – 5 ¼ inch square cut diagonally twice. 1 – 4 inch square for the center

- 1. Sew 2 of the small background triangles to adjacent sides of your 2 inch complimentary square.
- 2. Attach the half square star points to each side to make a flying goose.




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Sew two flying geese on opposite sides of your centre block. ------

Add a background square to each end of the remaining two flying geese and sew them on the other opposite sides.








Now assemble the outside sections

First sew the large background triangles to the remaining complementary triangles. Sew a point triangle to each end.



Sew the sections to the top and bottom of your block



Add the background squares to the end of the other two sections
