This is a 12 inch finished block



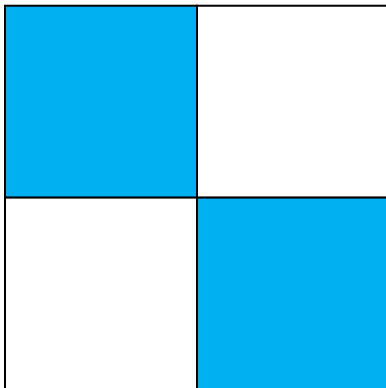
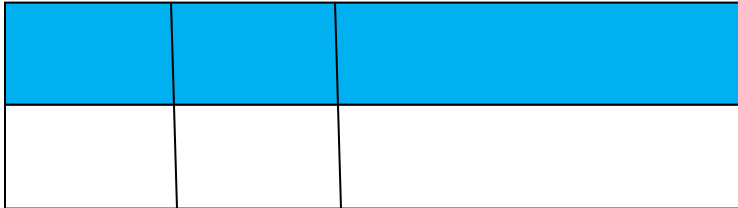
Background	Cut 1 (2 ½) inch strip by the width of the fabric. Sub cut this into 1 (22 inch strip) and 8 (2 ½ inch squares)
Print # 1 This is the dark blue in my sample	Cut 1 (2 ½ inch strip) by 22 inches
Print #2	Cut 1 (4 ½ inch Square) This is the center square Cut 1 (2 ½ inch strip) by 22 inches. Sub cut the 2 ½ inch strip into 4 (2 ½ x 4 ½) inch rectangles.
Print #3	Cut 1 (2 ½ inch strip) by the width of the fabric. Sub cut this strip into 8 (2 ½ inch squares) and 4 (2 ½ x 4 ½ inch rectangles.

Construction

Four Patch Units

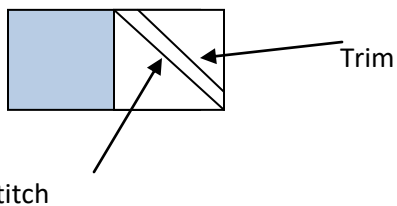
- Take the background 22 inch strip and place it RST with the print #1 22 inch strip and stitch with a scant ¼ inch seam.
- Press to the dark.

- Cut the strip into **8** segments.
- Pair the segments and stitch to make 4 four patches.

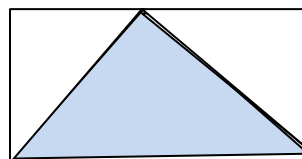


Chevron Units A Using Background #1 and Print # 3

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of each 2 ½ inch background squares.
- RST Place a background square on one end of the 2 ½ inch x 4 ½ inch print 3 rectangles.
- Stitch on the line. Trim the extra off and press. Repeat with the other 3 units.



- Repeat this step adding a 2 ½ inch square to the opposite side making a flying geese unit.

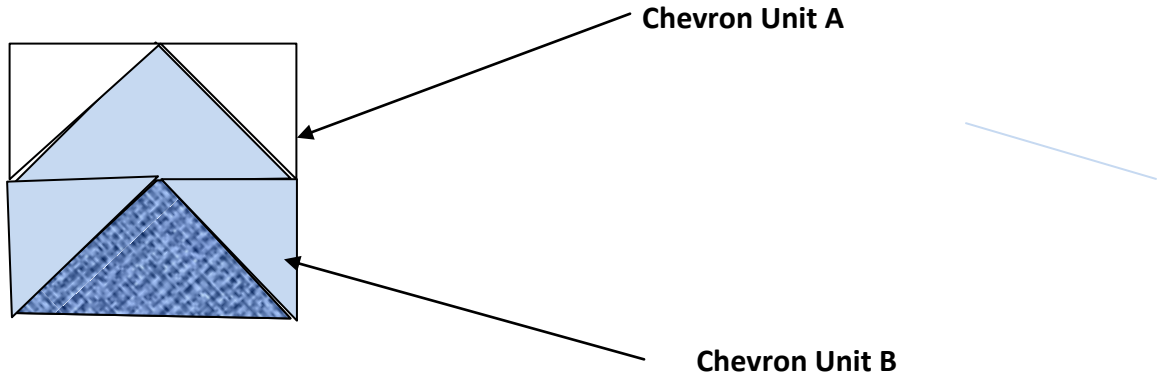


Chevron Unit B Using Print #2 and Print # 3

- Draw a diagonal line on the back of the print #3 squares.
- RST Place a background square on one end of the print # 2 rectangle.
- Following the instructions for chevron unit A complete 4 chevron unit B units.

Joining the Chevron A and B Units

Assembling the Block

Layout the units as in the block at the top.

Stitch together as you would a nine patch.
