President's Challenge: A Celebration of Hand Stitching

The first thing you see when you open our newsletter is our logo surrounded by the words "Preserving the Art". Our stated guild objective is "to encourage the preservation of this traditional artistic form of needlework (i.e. quilting)". With this in mind the President's Challenge is to create a small quilt, no greater than 64 inches in circumference, all done by hand sewing. Hand piecing, hand quilting or hand tying, applique, or embroidery may all be included in your quilt which will include backing, batting and a top. Your piece could be self bound with the backing fabric folded over and hand stitched to the

front, or a pull through with no binding; don't forget to add a label. We have members who are hand stitchers, a good library for reference, so use our resources and see what you can stitch.

The quilts will be presented at our annual meeting June 2020 and will be included in a display at our Quilt Show in September 2020.
