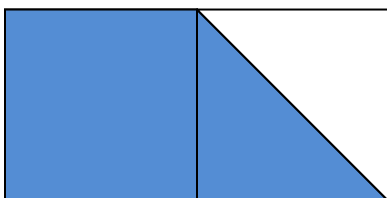
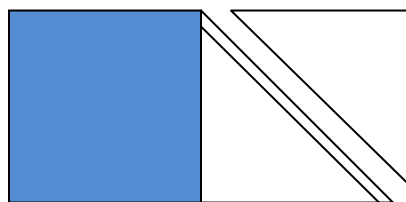
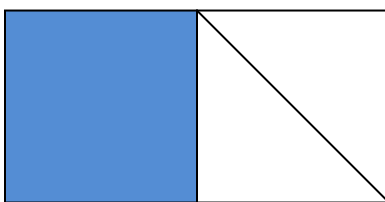
Materials and Cutting

Background	Cut a 14 X 3 ½ inch strip Cut 4 3 ½ inch squares
Print # 1	Cut a 14 X 3 ½ inch strip Cut (4) 3 ½ X 6 ½ inch rectangles. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the squares.
Print #2 center pinwheel	Cut (4) 3 ½ inch squares. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each of the squares.

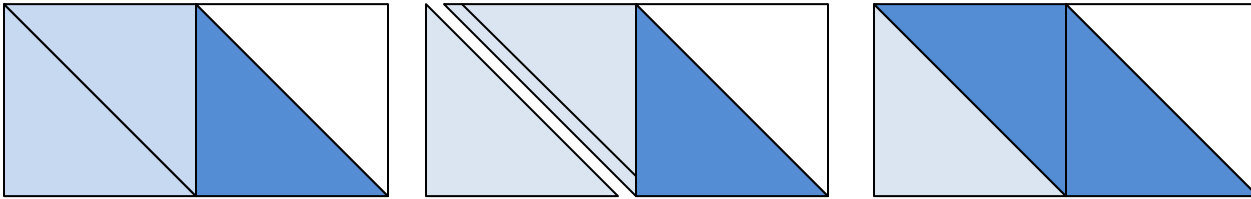
Construction

1. Place a background square RST on top of a print # 1 rectangle.

Sew on the line. Trim leaving ¼ inch seam allowance. **You could also sew a ¼ inch seam on the waste triangle and use in another project.** Press



Now sew a 3 ½ inch print #2 square on the other end of each rectangle. Make sure your diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Trim leaving a 1/4 inch seam allowance. Press.

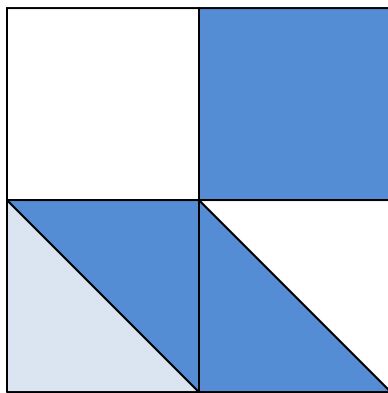


Make 4

2. Sew your 14 inch X 3 ½ inch background strip to your 14 X 3 ½ inch print # 1 strip. Press to the dark.

Cut this strip into (4) 3 ½ inch segments.

3. Sew together each unit as shown in the diagram below.



Make 4.

4. Sew the 4 units together as in photo at top to complete your Shooting Star Block.
